






















































## IB PYP CELEBRATES INTERNATIONAL LITERACY DAY


#### YOUNG SCIENTISTS

PYP V students while studying the properties of matter, visited the science lab to further understand the physical and chemical changes that matter goes through. Using the scientific method, they formed a hypothesis about how baking soda would react with vinegar; They then tested their hypothesis by mixing the two, made observations and recorded the data. The young learners were pleasantly surprised when the balloons fitted on their flasks inflated with gas produced due to this chemical reaction.

The experiment helped reinforce what chemical and physical changes are, and the vital role reactants play in forming a byproduct.







## PYP - MATH TRIVIA WEEK








## **DEFENCE DAY**

In this upbeat and motivational song, learners were able to identify different forms of armed forces and their purpose. They discussed the significance of Defence Day and learnt how the whole nation came together on this day to defend its freedom, honour and sovereignty. The students talked about then President of Pakistan, Gen. Ayub Khan's address to the nation, which united the nation and helped us achieve victory in this 17 day war. Our young PYP learners analyzed the text structure by identifying cause and effect from the President's speech. They were also able to make connections to their learning in the past week as well as extend their thinking and relate to the making of Pakistan.



## **LEARNING BEYOND BORDERS**

In an effort to expand on learning and leadership opportunities, our students from PYP IV met with students from Crossroads International School, India on 24th November 2021 in an online session. Through discussion and dialogue, the students shared common vision and strong connections about the rights and responsibilities of individuals in their societies. 






















## PYP - CRAZY HAIR DAY




LAI Observing 73rd death anniversary of Quaid-e-Azam





The MYP students, in their INS class discussed the challenges and problems people of Pakistan face today; and how to make it a prosperous country by following Quaid's principles. In Language Acquisition - URDU, The MYP I wrote an essay on 'Mera Pyara Pakistan, and had conversations about the struggles of making an Independent State by Jinnah.

A moment of silence was observed as tribute to the "Founder of the Nation". People from different walks of life visit the Quaid's mausoleum in












































#### A Walk Through **Mughal History**

The Students of PYP IV, V and MYP I went on an excursion to The Badshahi Mosque and Lahore Fort. In a state of awe admiration of the grandeur and magnificence of the Mughal Architecture, the learners walked young through the Hazuri Bagh to the monumental steps of the badshahi mosque, the Grand Entrance of the Lahore Fort to the Elephant Steps, Sheesh Mahal, Diwan e Khas and the Baradari; they learnt about the architecture, layout and design elements of both the places. The students drew motifs from the live study and did some mathematical exercises as part of the activities planned for the trip. The students experienced beauty, elegance, and scale that epitomizes the magnificence of these monuments. The skill, art and historic cultural achievements by the Mughal Emperors and their team of skilled masons and artisans is still unmatched.















#### The Land of Puppets

Puppets have been used since the earliest times to animate and communicate ideas, stories, society's needs, ways of life and various conquests of man. They have been part of ceremonies, rituals and carnivals. Puppetry is an expression that is understood by all. It connects with the audience at a much deeper level than words and language alone. Rafi Peer Theatre - the first of its kind in South Asia promotes the arts, focuses on culture and aims to educate and entertain through it. Our PYP I-III as part of the theme "How We Express Ourselves" undertook a trip to Rafi Peer Theatre and The Museum of Puppetry and witnessed first hand the magical art of puppetry and shadow figures.

The students were fascinated by the display of puppets from around the world, A magic show and gymnastics performance were all part of this amazing experience that concluded with an experience of an Urdu oracy session by Tasneem Peerzada. The PYP students had their lunch under the colourful streamers and lanterns of the cafeteria and left back for the school with countless memories.



























#### TRIP TO 'GURDWARA **DARBAR SAHIB KARTARPUR'**

The Kartarpur Corridor is known as the corridor of 'International peace and harmony' and is a 4.2-km-long passage connecting the town of Dera Baba Nanak in India with the Kartarpur Sahib Gurdwara in Pakistan's Narowal district.

The LAI MYP & DP students visited this place of immense historic and religious significance in full protocol, observing the sanctity and decorum of this place of Sikh pilgrimage. The IB learners explored the main Gurdwara and the 20-foot well, made of small red bricks which is 500 years old and believed to have been built during the lifetime of Guru Nanak Dev. The students learned about the three principles of Kirat Karo, Naam Japo, Wand Chako, which Guru Nanak gave, meaning 'work hard for a livelihood, keep remembering God and share your bounties with the world'. 'Guru's teachings have been for inter faith harmony, peace and universal brotherhood. Guru Nanak believed in equality between castes, religions, and genders and gave the word 'Ik Onkar' meaning there is only one God. They also learned about the 5 K's of their Faith. The students thoroughly enjoyed the visit and came back with a spiritually enlightened mind about Sikhism.

#### 'PAK SAR ZAMEEN'

At the stroke of midnight on August 14, 1947, seventy four years ago, Pakistan came into being as an independent nation; A free country!





#### International Day for the Preservation of the Ozone layer

The Ozone layer, a fragile shield of gas, protects the Earth from the harmful portion of the rays of the sun, thus helping preserve life on the planet. On September 16, 1987, the United Nations and 45 other countries signed the Montreal Protocol, on substances that deplete the Ozone layer. Every year, this day is celebrated as the International Day for the Preservation of the Ozone layer.

The LAI MYP students learned about the history and significance of the day in their science lessons, they observed and celebrated the day by talking about various ways to protect the ozone layer from the use of controlled and ozone depleting substances, so that human and other life forms can continue to exist and flourish for current and future generations that inhabit Mother Earth. They also had discussions on how to contribute significantly to united global efforts to address climate change, protect human health and sustain the ecosystems for a better tomorrow.

## Student Profile Building Workshops - MYP & DP

They advise and work with the students to build a portfolio and resume, so all necessary components are covered when it is time to apply for higher education. Moreover, the admission advisors help in comprehensive admissions planning and procedures. The workshops progress into customised one-on-one sessions with the students and their parents.

















## IBDP Organizes the LAI Bazaar

The LAI Bazaar was a fundraising event initiated by the students of DP 1 to generate donations for the Medicare Health Foundation – an organization dedicated to ensuring high-quality gynecological and pediatric care for low-income or underprivileged communities in Pakistan. The LAI Bazaar products included a wide variety of second-hand books for students of all ages, as well as some creative accessories designed and produced entirely by our own DP students! These included bookmarks, posters, postcards, and bracelets. The Iron Man bookmarks and feminist posters alike were a huge hit with both the student body and the faculty – everyone who came to the LAI Bazaar walked away with a trinket or a book that brightened their day. The Bazaar managed to make approximately Rs. 70,000, all of which was donated to the Medicare Foundation.



## LAI Rizq Chapter - A Charity Drive

As part of the LAI Rizq Chapter's regular activities, volunteers from DP 1 attended a ration drive on 11th October 2021. The ration distribution process is a hands-on learning experience for all volunteers, involving the verification of all ration recipients – people from underprivileged communities or low-income families, specifically widowed or divorced mothers or those with sick family members – and the distribution of food packages. Moreover, on World Food Day, the LAI Rizq Chapter distributed food to an impoverished community near Falcon Complex Gulberg through the Rizq Foodbank. Volunteers from DP 1 and 2 participated in this activity. Such activities are not only an important part of the community service that is encouraged in LAI as well as by the CAS program, but also an important learning experience that allows students to learn how NGOs and volunteer programs operate.



















#### IBDP II STUDENT INTERNS AT AKHUWAT
