# LEARNING ALLIANCE INTERNATIONAL

## ANNUAL PROCLAMATION

The Annual Proclamation Ceremony is held at the start of each academic year to recognize and celebrate the effort, perseverance, and achievements of students from Classes MYP I to DP II for the preceding academic year.

### **PROCLAMATION AWARDS CRITERIA – INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE**

At Learning Alliance International, students from Classes MYP I to DP II who demonstrate exceptional commitment to academic excellence and co-curricular engagement are honored at the Annual Proclamation Ceremony held in the preceding academic year. Medals and co-curricular blazers are awarded in recognition of their outstanding achievements.

### **ACADEMIC MEDAL**

#### **MYP I – IV:**

Gold, Silver, and Bronze Medals are awarded to the top three students in each class **section**, recognizing their consistent academic excellence and highest cumulative internal assessment results.

#### **Eligibility**

- **Gold Medal:** Minimum overall average of 80%
- **Silver Medal:** Minimum overall average of 75%
- **Bronze Medal:** Minimum overall average of 70%

#### **MYP V eAssessment Result:**

Students of MYP V are awarded **Gold, Silver, and Bronze Medals** on the basis of their **MYP V eAssessments results**, according to the following criteria:

GRADE	MEDALS
<b>50 points and above</b>	Gold
<b>48 - 49 points</b>	Silver
<b>46 - 47 points</b>	Bronze

#### **DP I:**

Gold, Silver, and Bronze Medals are awarded to the top three students in DP I, recognizing their consistent academic excellence and highest cumulative internal assessment results.

#### **Eligibility**

- **Gold Medal:** Minimum overall average of 80%
- **Silver Medal:** Minimum overall average of 75%
- **Bronze Medal:** Minimum overall average of 70%

### **DP II External Examination Results:**

All Medals are awarded based on the total points earned from grades achieved in the first attempt of **DP II external examinations**, i.e. May/June session each year, according to the following criteria:

GRADE	MEDALS
<b>40 points and above</b>	Gold
<b>38 - 39 points</b>	Silver
<b>36 - 37 points</b>	Bronze

### **NAEM SALAM MEHTA SCHOLARSHIP**

The Naem Salam Mehta Scholarship and Gold Medal is awarded to one Learning Alliance International student from MYP V, who achieves the highest achievement level, with a minimum of 50/56 achievement level in the eAssessment Result.

The scholarship is for use in the Diploma Programme (DP I) and is renewable in DP II based on the student's DP I results. It is continued on the basis of overall performance in the six subjects and the core components of the DP I final examinations, May/June session, with a minimum achievement level of 40 out of 45 points. Retaken subjects will not be considered for improving grades to qualify for the scholarship.

The Naem Salam Mehta Scholarship is **non-transferable**. If no student meets the required standard in a given year, this category will remain vacant.

## **SPORTS MEDALS**

### **MYP I - DP II**

#### **EXCELLENCE IN SPORT AWARD (1 MEDAL EACH FOR A MALE AND FEMALE STUDENT IN EACH CLASS LEVEL)**

The Special Medal for Excellence in Sport is awarded to the best sportsperson (boy and girl) in **each year group** based on total points earned through performance, leadership, and representation during the academic year. Two medals are presented per class level, one to the top-ranked male student and one to the top-ranked female student.

#### **Award Criteria:**

- Award points are calculated by a panel of 3-5 faculty members.
- To qualify for the **Excellence in Sport**, a student must earn a minimum of **30 points**. The top-scoring male and female students from each class will receive the award, based on the highest points earned.
- If no student meets the required points or wins criteria, the medal for that class and category will not be awarded.
- Students must maintain their Portfolio on their Citizen's portal each term.

*A student may be awarded only one Medal for National and International Excellence in Sports for all qualifying achievements within a single academic year.*

## **CO-CURRICULAR MEDALS:**

Co-Curricular Awards are based on but are not limited to the following categories:

<b>CATEGORY</b>	<b>COMPETITION/ ACTIVITIES</b>
Public Speaking & Debates	Debates, MUNs, elocution contests, declamation, oratory, and other speech-related competitions etc.
Arts	Art exhibitions and competitions in painting, drawing, calligraphy, sculpture, craft design, and other art-related events. Drama and theatre productions, dance and music performances, and a wide range of other creative expressions.
Science, Technology, Robotics, Engineering, & Mathematics (STREAM)	Science fairs, robotics contests, coding hackathons, STEM expos, Mathematics platforms and relevant online certifications etc.
Literary	Essay writing, short story, poetry, spelling bees, and creative writing platforms, contests and editorial roles, School magazines, newsletters, etc.
Media	Video/film making, photography, design layout, social media and digital engagement, innovative media projects, social media impact etc.
Business & Entrepreneurship	Entrepreneurship challenges, marketing simulations, investment competitions, and business fairs, business & startup competitions etc.
Community Service & Environmental Initiatives	Volunteer work, charity drives, environmental campaigns, and leadership in social awareness projects etc.

### **EXCELLENCE IN CO-CURRICULAR AWARD:**

The Excellence in Co-Curricular Award is awarded to students from Classes MYP I - DP II who demonstrate outstanding dedication, creativity, and leadership across **one co-curricular domain mentioned above**. The award is based on total points earned through active participation, initiative, and overall activities that fall under, but are not limited to the above mentioned categories.

#### **Award Criteria:**

- To qualify for the **Excellence in Co-Curricular Award**, a student must earn a minimum of **30 points in a single category**.
- This award is **point** and **category** based, calculated by a panel of 3 or 5 faculty members.
- Only **one** student with the highest points per category/per year group is eligible for this award.
- In case of a tie, more than one student may be considered for this award.
- Documented evidence (certificates, photos, official communication) must support all claims.
- A Co-Curricular Committee may adjust points for exceptional, high-impact achievements.
- Students must maintain a Co-Curricular Portfolio on their Citizen's portal each term.

### **SPECIAL AWARD – CO-CURRICULAR**

#### **Platinum, Gold, Silver & Bronze Medals:**

#### **Award Criteria:**

- **Special Awards – Co-Curricular: Platinum, Gold, Silver & Bronze Medals** are **WIN** based awards.
- These medals are awarded to students who have achieved wins across **single or multiple** categories.

- Documented evidence (certificates, photos, official communication) must support all claims.
- A Co-Curricular Committee may adjust points for exceptional, high-impact achievements.
- Students must maintain a Co-Curricular Portfolio on their Citizen's portal each term.
- All wins earned in the **same category** will be consolidated and counted as a single win for this medal.
- Students who have already received the **Excellence in Co-Curricular Award** for a particular category, may qualify for the **Special Award**, once their previous category win has been excluded from consideration.

*A student may be awarded only one Medal for all qualifying achievements within a single academic year.*

MEDAL	CRITERIA	
<b>Platinum Medal</b>	Awarded 6 and above international and/or national wins in multiple co-curricular fields, online or in person.	Top 10 International Wins Top 5 National Wins
<b>Gold Medal</b>	Awarded to 5 international and/or national wins in multiple co-curricular fields, online or in person.	Top 10 International Wins Top 5 National Wins
<b>Silver Medal</b>	Awarded to 3-4 international and/or national wins in multiple co-curricular fields, online or in person.	Top 10 International Wins Top 5 National Wins
<b>Bronze Medal</b>	Awarded to 1-2 international and/or national wins in multiple co-curricular fields, online or in person.	Top 10 International Wins Top 5 National Wins

*A student may receive only one Medal for National and International Excellence in Co-Curricular activities for all achievements within a single academic year.*

### **SPORTS & CO-CURRICULAR BLAZER AWARD**

For students of Classes MYP III - DP II, the Sports & Co-Curricular Blazer is awarded in recognition of three consecutive years of exceptional and consistent performance in sports and co-curricular activities at the **national or international** level during the preceding academic years.

Policy Guidelines:

- Eligibility requires three consecutive years of outstanding and consistent performance in the respective category.
- Students with a disciplinary warning in the previous academic year are ineligible.
- The recipient list is renewed annually; students may retain their Blazer as a keepsake but may not wear it as part of the formal uniform unless re-awarded.
- Students must maintain minimum passing grades to remain eligible.
- The School Board's decision is made through a voting process and is final and non-contestable.
- There is no quota for the Blazer; it is awarded solely on merit and sustained performance.
- Awardees may wear the Blazer as part of their formal uniform during the year of conferment.
- In years where standards are not met, no Blazers may be awarded.
- Students who transfer campuses or withdraw before the Proclamation Ceremony will still be invited to receive their award.
- Students must maintain their Portfolio on their Citizen's portal each term.

### **STUDENT COUNCIL SPECIAL MEDAL CRITERIA**

4 Medals are awarded from within the Student Council members of the last academic year for the categories:

1. Best Captain

2. Best Vice Captain
3. Best President
4. Best Vice President

**Minimum Criteria:**

- Points are calculated by a panel of 3 or 5 faculty members.
- The student getting the highest score based on the framework above will be awarded this Medal.
- Students must maintain their Portfolio on their Citizen's portal each term.

**If no student meets the required criteria, the medal for any particular category and class will NOT be awarded for that year.**
